# Falklands, South Georgia, and the Antarctic Peninsula

## **Antarctica – History & Exploration**

- Endurance: Shackleton's Incredible Voyage by Alfred Lansing
  - o A gripping, definitive account of Shackleton's legendary survival story on South Georgia.
- The Worst Journey in the World by Apsley Cherry-Garrard
  - A beautifully written, harrowing firsthand account of Scott's ill-fated expedition. Reflective and emotionally powerful.
- Madhouse at the End of the Earth by Julian Sancton
  - A modern, cinematic retelling of the Belgian Antarctic Expedition—essential for understanding the challenges of early polar overwintering.

- The Crystal Desert: Summers in Antarctica by David G. Campbell
  - Written by a naturalist, this poetic book blends ecology and science with vivid descriptions of Antarctic life.
- Field Guide to the Wildlife of South Georgia by Robert Burton & John Croxall
  - o A portable, user-friendly guide—perfect for identifying species during landings.
- Seabirds: A Natural History by Tony Gaston
  - A comprehensive overview of seabird biology and behavior—valuable background for spotting at sea.

#### **Climate & Environmental Thought**

- Antarctica: A Biography by David Day
  - A sweeping geopolitical and environmental history—deep context for the continent's evolving role.
