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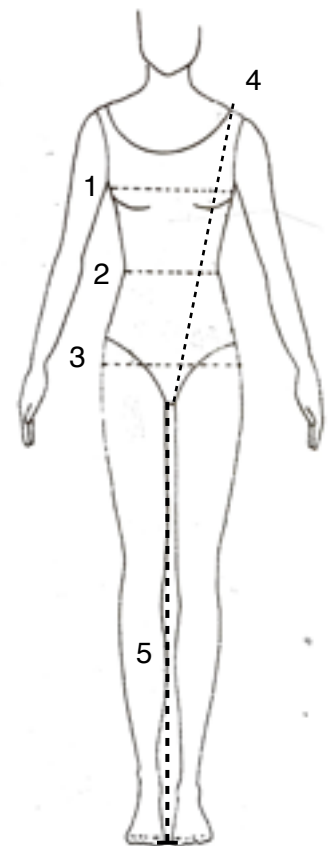

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Important Sizing Tips

Dancer needs to be measured in a light weight garment, like a body suit.

1. Chest	Measure over the fullest part of chest having dancer's arms relaxed at sides.
2. Waist	Measure around the narrowest part of your natural waistline.
3. Hip	Stand with heels together and measure the fullest part of the hips and buttocks, making sure measurement tape is parallel to floor.
4. Girth	Place tape measure at center shoulder, down the front torso, between the legs, up the back and to the same shoulder. Hold the tape loosely.
5. Inseam	Measure inside of leg from crotch to the floor.



- Use measurement charts as a general guide to determine the size you need for sample(s) and/or placing group order.
- The girth is the most important measurement unless you are ordering separates. If dancer's girth measurement is not within the size range of chest and hips you may need to request a short or long body length.
- When in doubt size up as it is usually easier for parents to adjust a costume down than having a costume too tight.
- When selecting sizes for children be sure to anticipate growth. Even a few months can make a difference in size needed.
- We are unable to process your order from measurements, please select sizes (child small, child medium... etc.) required from the measuring charts. Please email us if you need assistance in selecting sizes.
