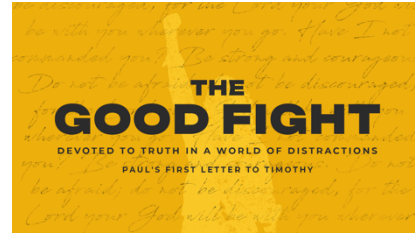

He Judged Me Faithful

 - How does this relate to our personal merit or qualifications? Does worthiness precede or follow God's calling?
- Paul states in 1 Timothy 1:13 that he was once a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a violent adversary.
 - What three words would you use to describe yourself before you were called by God?
 - Why is it essential to reflect on this?
- Examine the meaning and impact of the statement, "Every sin led Jesus to the cross."
- Discuss: To overflow in God's grace is to fully grasp how we came to salvation.
 - What are the implications of this within your prayer life?
 - How does this work itself out in day-to-day worship?
