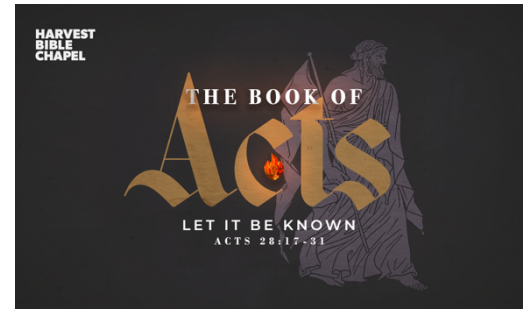

Life Group Questions / February 22, 2026

The Book of Acts
70 – Let It Be Known
Acts 28:17-31



1. In the introduction, it was said that “certainty about the gospel compels mission.” If you have that certainty, do you also have that compulsion? Do you sense the urgency of telling people about Jesus? If so, how does that play out in your life?
2. What excuses do people use for not being engaged in mission and sharing their faith?
3. In what ways have you seen “Christians” ignoring the plain teaching of God’s word to fashion their own set of values to justify their way of living?
4. John 6:22-71 is one of those tough passages about Jesus (so is Acts 28:26-27 from Isaiah 6:9-10). Despite how some people want to portray him today, Jesus often said and/or did things that turned people away. What do we need to do in our day to keep our resolve concerning the unapologetic proclamation of the Word?
5. Discuss the quote, “Hearing is not really hearing if the message is not acted upon” (John B. Polhill). Look at James 1:22-25.
6. Make a strategy together for inviting friends, family, neighbours, co-workers, and even strangers to our Easter services on Sunday, April 5.
7. Read Psalm 139:1-4 and rest in the knowledge that Christ knows us better than we know ourselves. Use this as the starting point for your prayer time together.
