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Life Group Questions / June 28, 2026

**The Things That Are Revealed**  
**7 – Because You Have Done This**  
**Genesis 3:14-24**



1. **What effects of sin have you seen in your own life? Tell a bit of your “before Christ” story. In what ways are you continuing to see the effects of sin in and around your life?**
2. Have you sensed a growing dissonance with evil as you’ve been maturing in Christ? Review the verses from Romans 7:15-24 and Paul’s response in Romans 8:31-37. Are you seeing more victory in your life as your hatred for evil and sin grows?
3. Look at Genesis 3:15 and mark it in your Bible as the “protevangelium,” the first form in which the gospel appears. Both the offspring of the serpent and of the woman will deal “mutually fatal blows” (Ian Vaillancourt) securing the other’s defeat and death. But the seed of the woman, Jesus Christ, will rise again. How does knowing this strengthen your faith?
4. Why do we tend to lose perspective on our personal difficulties and trials? What helps us gain a more biblical, Christ-centred understanding of what’s happening in our lives, in the world, and in redemptive history? In what ways do we see God’s grace overflowing to us?
5. OPTIONAL: Read 1 Corinthians 11:23-32 and observe the Lord’s Table together. This is God’s gift to us to remember his death until he comes. It was given to us so that we could be in communion with him and with each other in this fallen world in anticipation of a return to Eden.
