

2026 LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTION OCTOBER 17, 2026

VOTER INFORMATION

General local government elections in British Columbia are held every four years. Electors in the City of Parksville vote to elect the following:

- 1 Mayor
- 6 Councillors
- 2 Qualicum School District Trustees

The City of Parksville municipal council is made up of a Mayor and six Councillors each elected for a four-year term.

Voting Opportunities

General Voting Day is **Saturday, October 17, 2026**, from 8 am to 8 pm at the Jensen Centre, 132 Jensen Avenue East OR the Parksville Fellowship Baptist Church, 550 Pym Street, Parksville.



You may vote at *either* the Parksville Fellowship Baptist Church or at the Jensen Centre, *however*, whether you vote at an advance voting opportunity, or at one of the general voting day locations, you will be required to sign a written declaration that you have not voted previously at any other time or location during the election.

Advance Voting will take place **Wednesday, October 7 and Wednesday, October 14, 2026**, from 8 am to 8 pm at the Jensen Centre, 132 Jensen Avenue East, located next door to the Parksville Civic and Technology Centre.

Mail Ballot Voting will be available this election! Application forms will be available at City Hall as well as on the City's LTP site starting September 1.

Resident Elector

You may vote in the Parksville municipal election as a ***resident*** elector if you:

1. Are a Canadian citizen; AND
2. Are, or will be, 18 years of age or older (**October 17, 2008**) on or before general voting day; AND
3. Have lived in BC for at least 6 months (as of **April 16, 2026**) prior to registration; AND
4. Be a resident of the municipality on the day of registration; AND
5. Are not disqualified from voting by the *Local Government Act* or any other act.

If you meet all of the above requirements you can vote and it does not matter whether you rent or own your home.

The City of Parksville no longer uses a voters' list; therefore, all voters will register on the day you vote at either an advance voting opportunity or on general voting day.

When arriving to vote, **you will be required to provide two pieces of identification**: one containing your name and address, the other containing your name and signature. If you do not have documentation showing residency, then two pieces of identification [at least one with a signature] are still required and you must then make a solemn declaration as to your residency.

ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF ID INCLUDE:

- BC driver's licence
- BC identification card issued by Motor Vehicle Branch
- Owner's certificate of insurance and vehicle licence issued by ICBC
- BC CareCard
- Birth certificate
- SIN card issued by Human Resources Development Canada
- Canadian passport
- Citizenship card issued by Citizenship and Immigration Canada
- Real property tax notice issued by City of Parksville
- Credit card or debit card issued by a savings institution
- Utility bill for electricity, natural gas, water, telephone, or cable/internet services.

Non-Resident Property Elector

The property must be in the name(s) of individuals and not in the name of a company.

If you own property in the City of Parksville, but live somewhere else in British Columbia, you may be eligible to vote as a **non-resident property elector** if you:

1. Are a Canadian citizen; AND
2. Are, or will be, 18 years of age or older (**October 17, 2008**) on or before general voting day; AND
3. Have lived in BC for at least 6 months (as of **April 16, 2026**) prior to registration; AND
4. Have owned the property in the City of Parksville for at least 30 days before you register to vote (**September 16, 2026**, is last day to meet 30-day ownership requirement); AND
5. You must not be eligible to register as a resident elector in the City of Parksville, AND
6. Are not disqualified from voting by the *Local Government Act* or any other act.

When registering, you will be required to provide two pieces of identification: one containing your name and address, the other with your name and signature. In addition to the identification, you will need satisfactory proof of ownership in the form of a tax notice, assessment notice or other legal documentation proving property ownership, such as a bill of sale issued prior to **September 16, 2026**.

Non-resident property electors can only vote once, regardless of the number of properties they own in the City of Parksville.

If more than one person owns the property, only one owner may register and that person must have the written consent of a majority of the other owners; and Section 66(1)(f) of the Local Government Act states that the only persons who are registered owners, either as joint tenants or tenants in common, are individuals who are not holding the property in trust for a corporation or another trust.

If you meet all the requirements, you may register on the day you vote at either an advance voting opportunity or on general voting day. However, if more than one person is registered as an owner on the property's land title, a "**Non-Resident Elector Consent Form**" containing signed consent from the majority of the registered owners is required.

The "**Non-Resident Elector Consent Form**" is written consent from the majority of the registered owners appointing one of the registered owners as the non-resident property elector for the property.

Note: *If you reside or own property not on the City of Parksville street name listing but have a "Parksville" address, you are in an electoral area of the Regional District of Nanaimo. Please visit the Regional District of Nanaimo website at rdn.bc.ca or contact their corporate administration offices, 6300 Hammond Bay Road, Nanaimo, in person or by toll free phone at 1 877 607-4111 for requirements and information on the electoral area election process.*

I own a company or business located within the City; do I get a vote?

No. A corporation is not entitled to be registered as an elector or have a representative registered as an elector. There is no corporate vote in BC.
