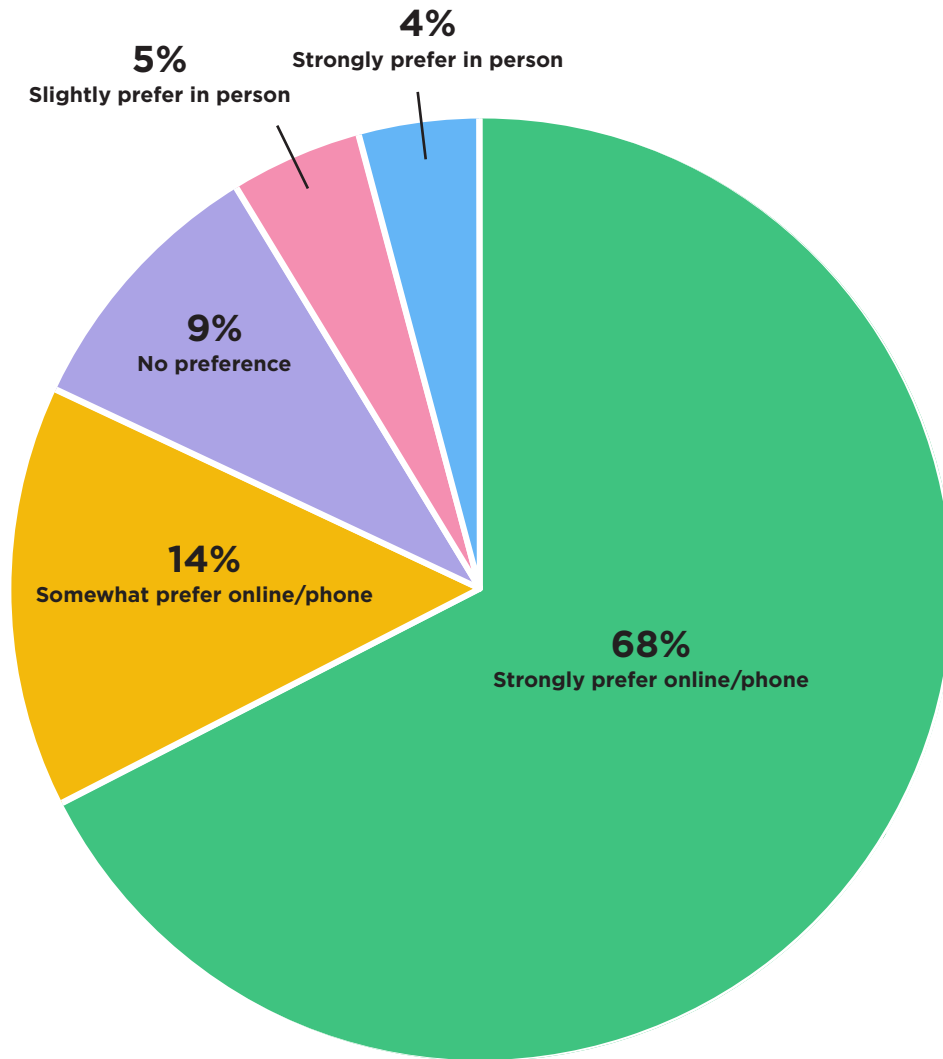


Results of Reopening and Recovery Public Survey

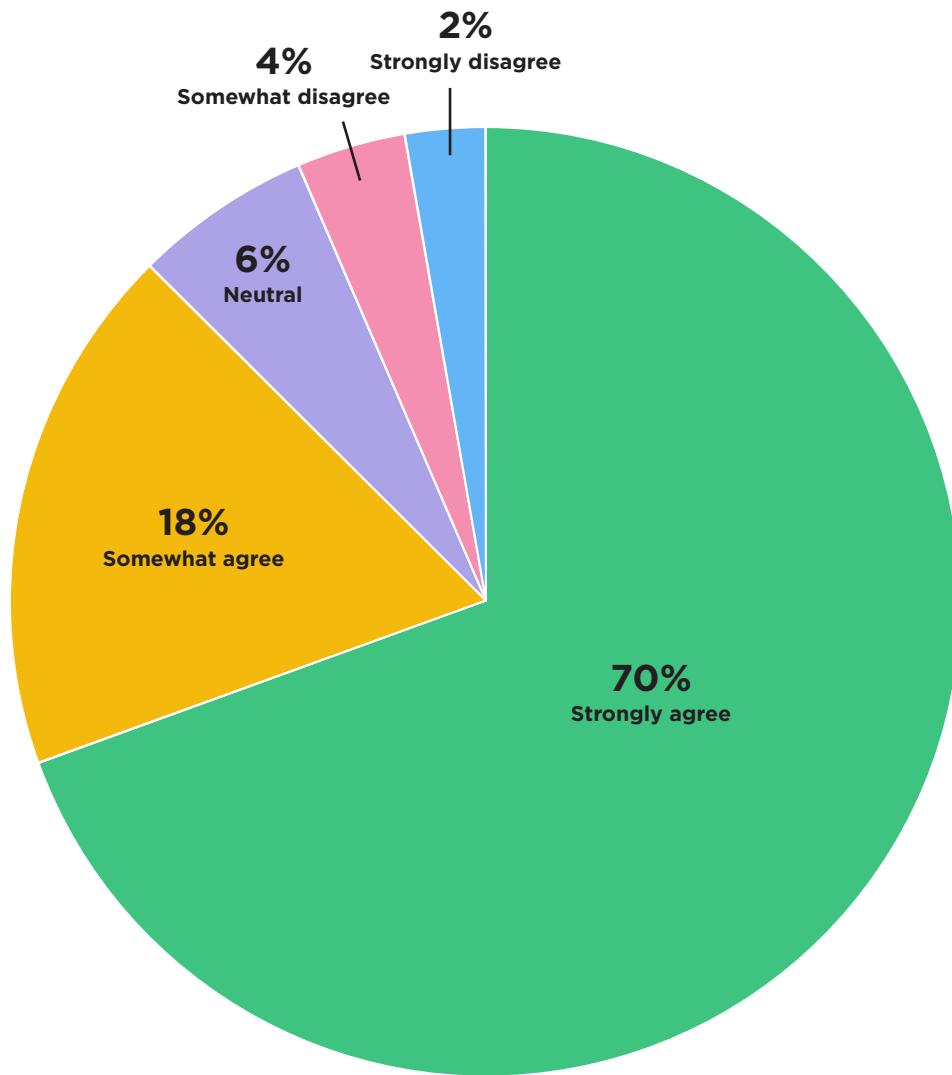
Survey ran from May 5 to June 14, 2020 and received a total of 4,500 responses

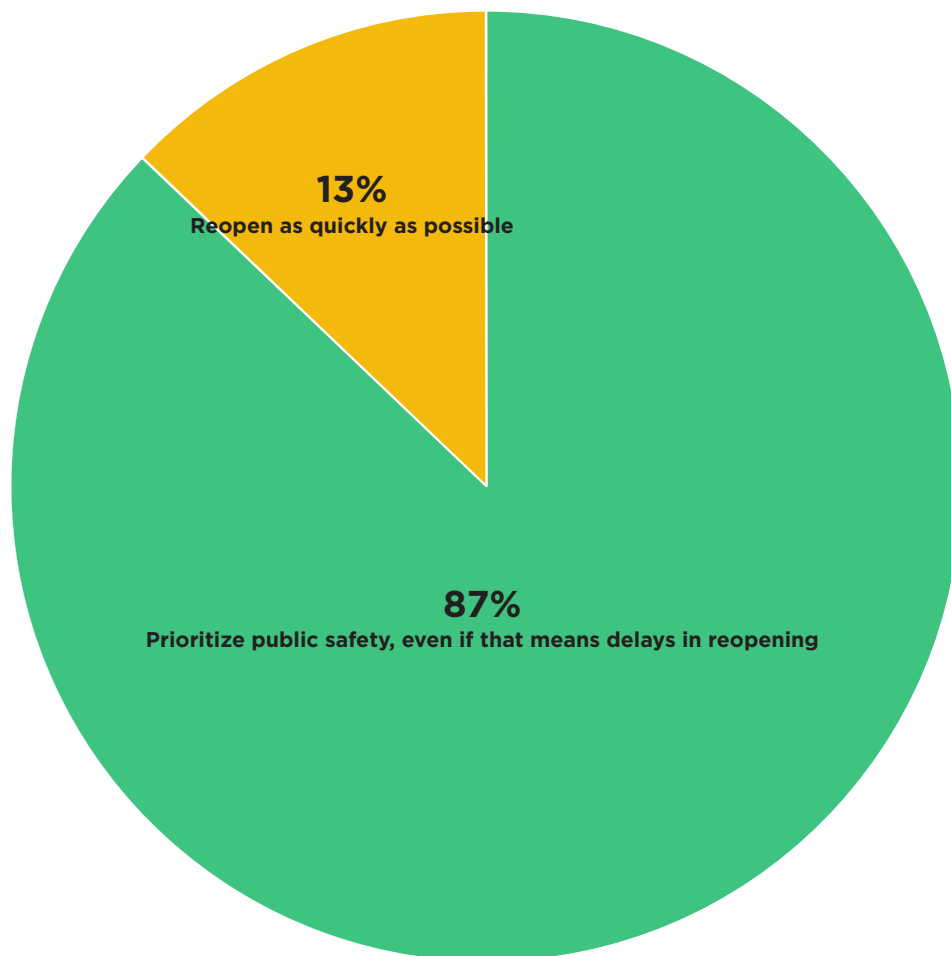
Survey ran from May 5 to June 14, 2020.

The City of Brampton should work to make as many services as possible available online so residents do not have to visit City facilities in person.



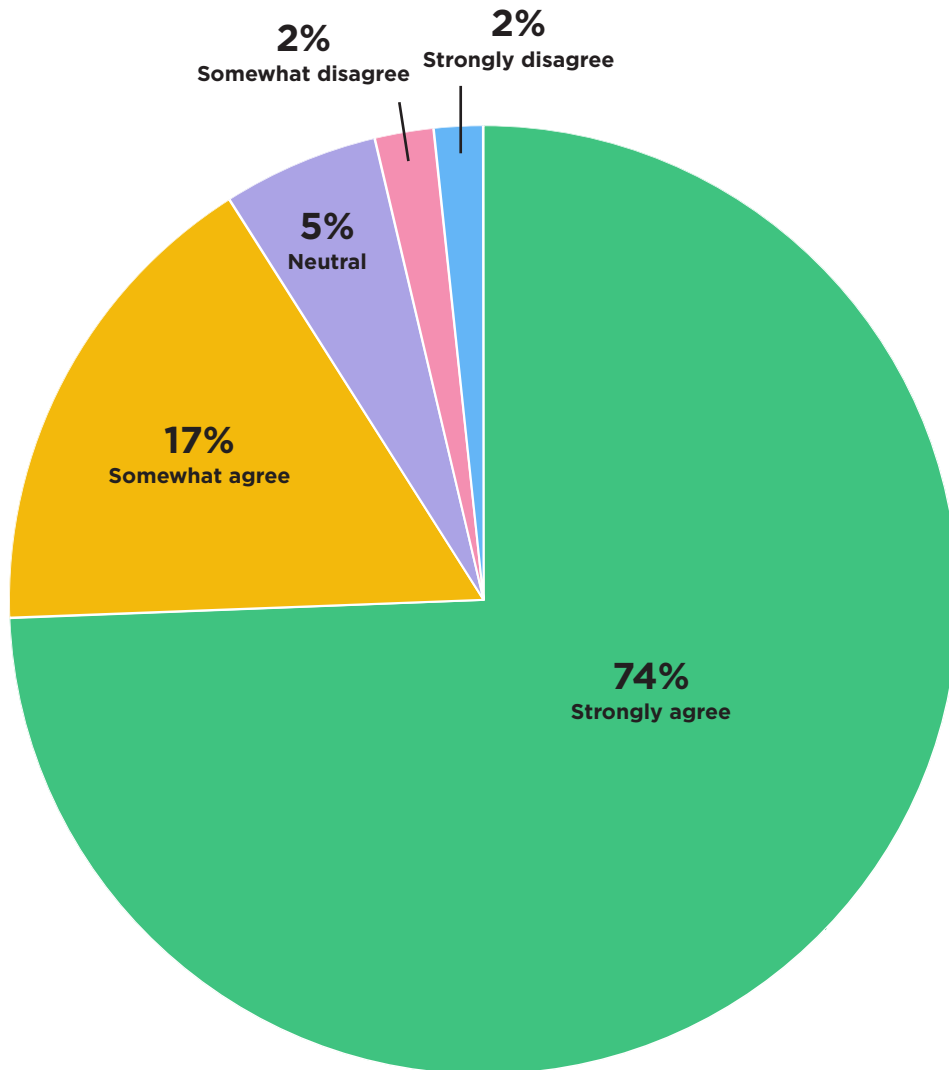

When it comes to reopening City facilities, which approach do you prefer:



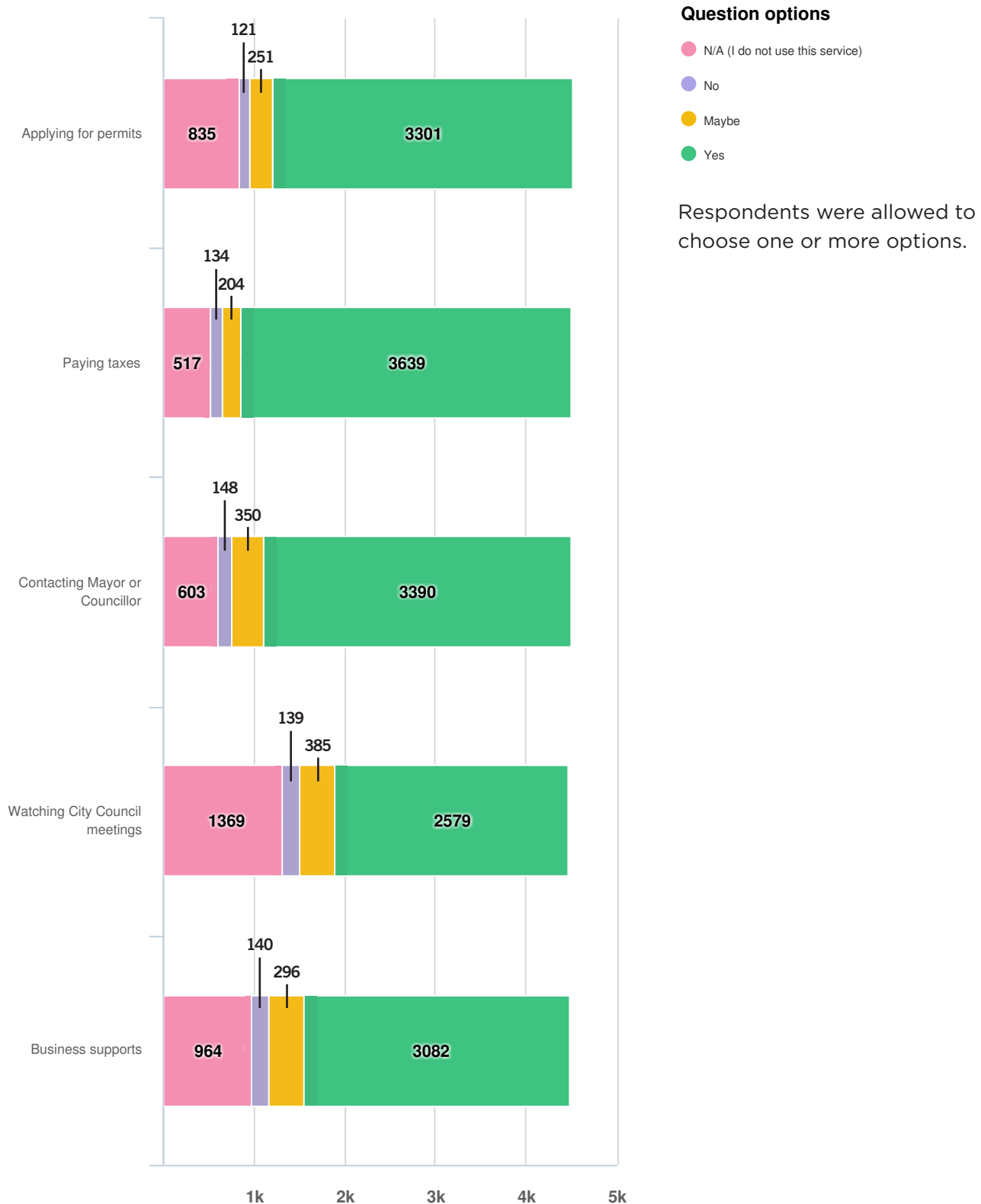

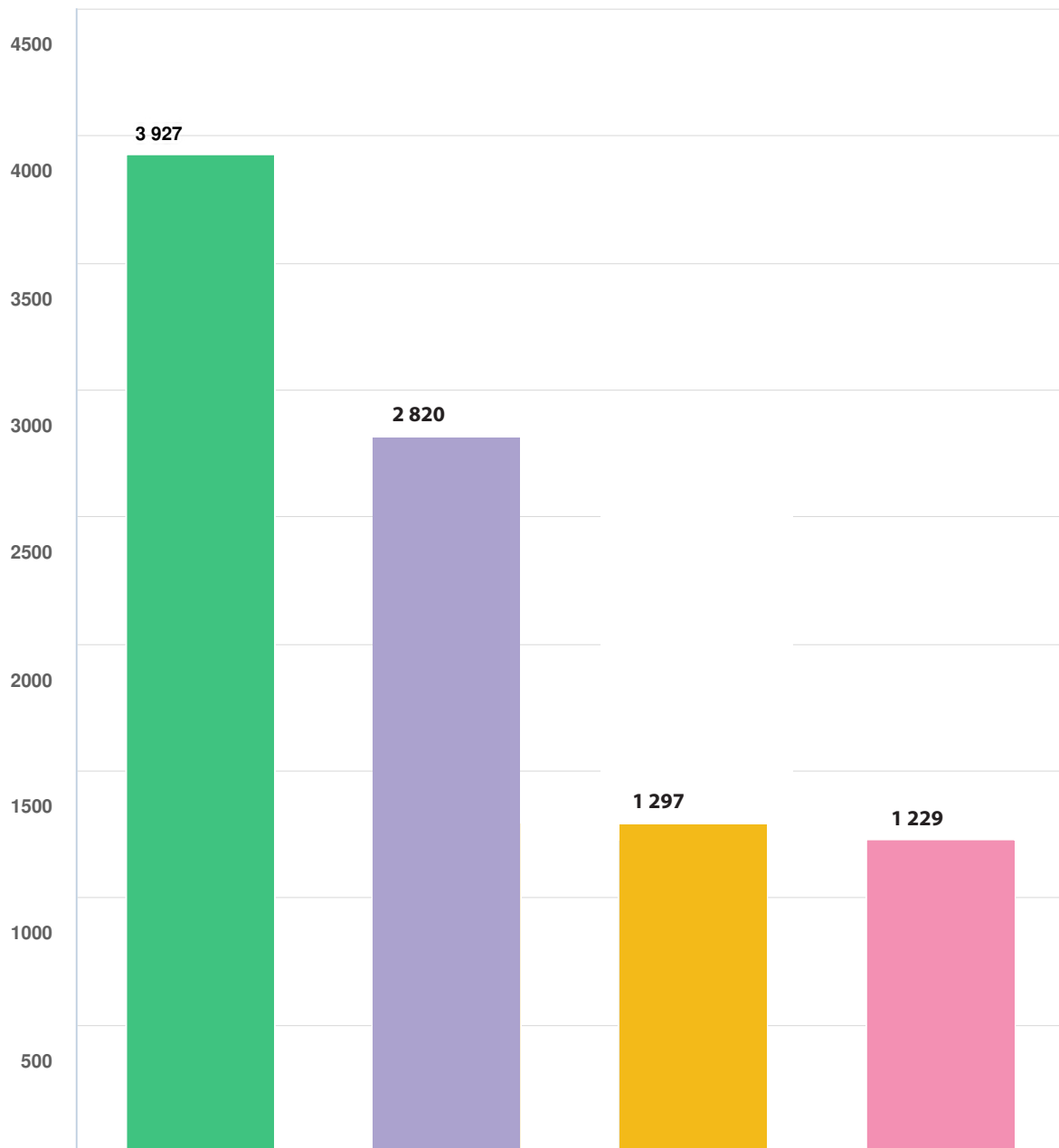

When the time comes to begin reopening City facilities (e.g. City Hall, recreation centres, etc), which measures would you support?

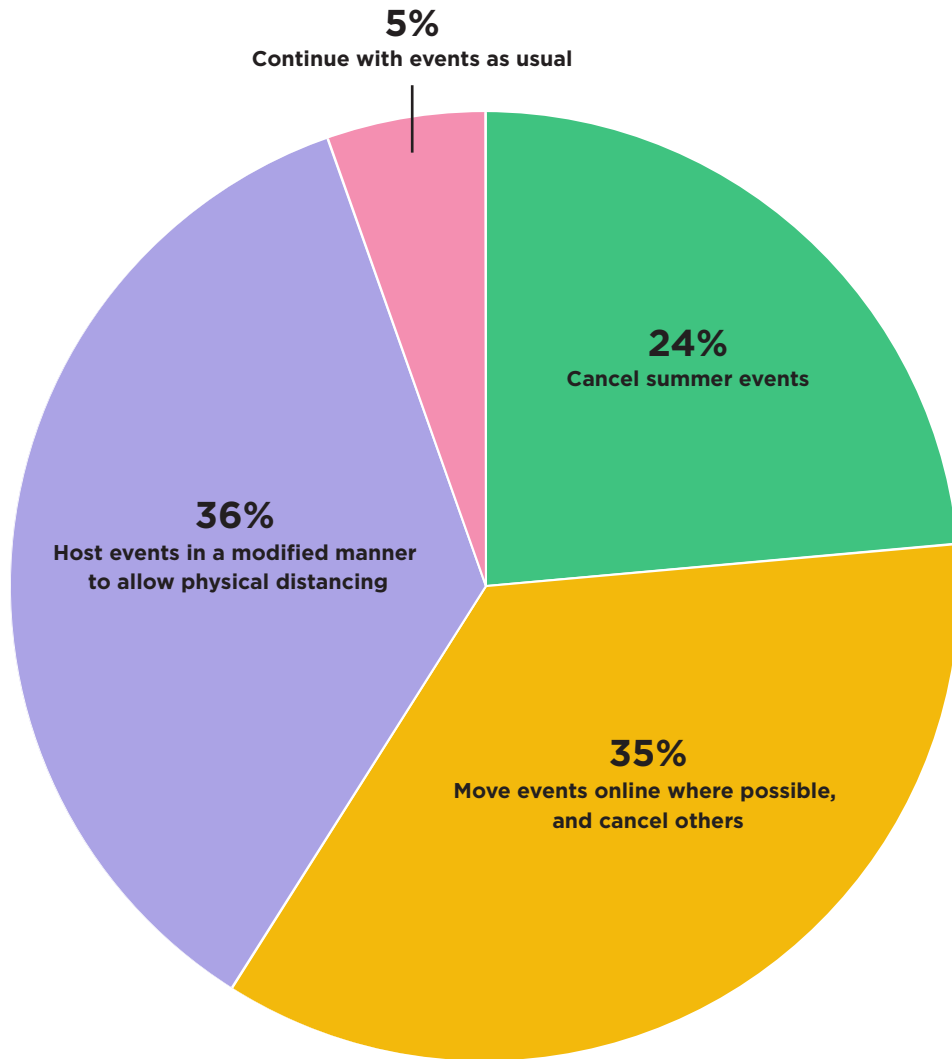


Question options Respondents were allowed to choose one or more options.

- Limit the number of services offered at City facilities

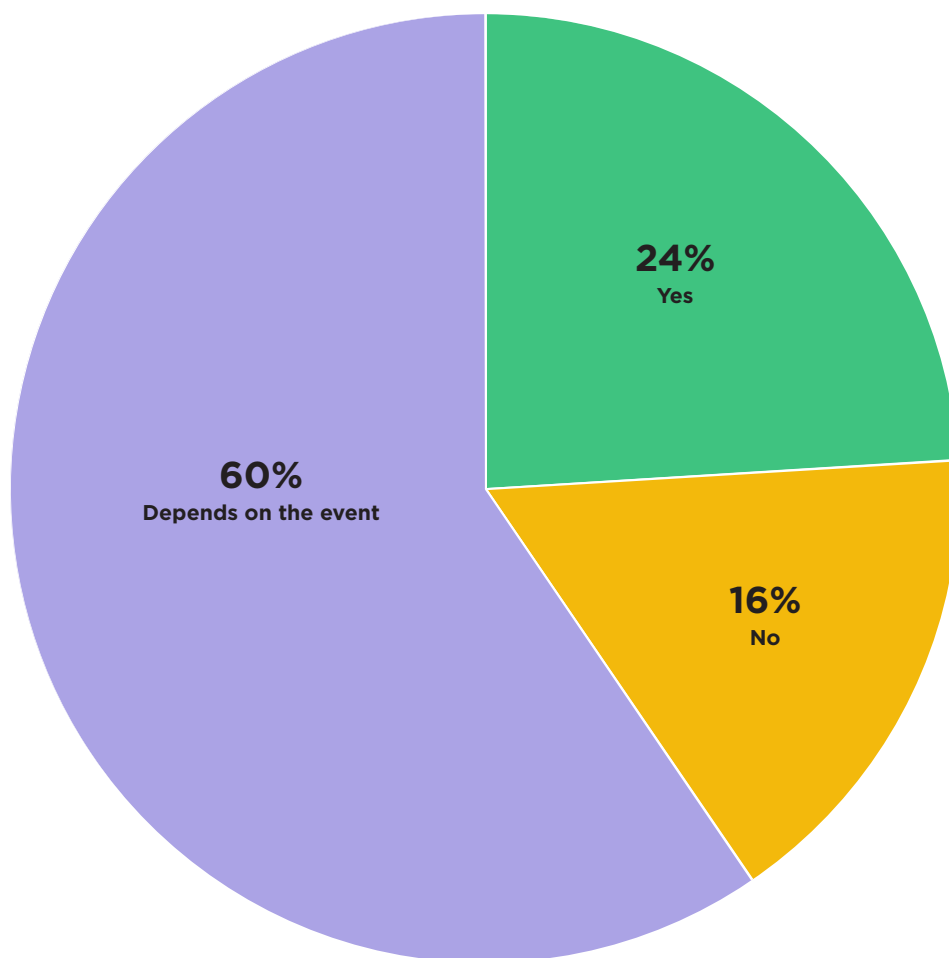

What do you think would be the best way to proceed with City-led events during the summer:



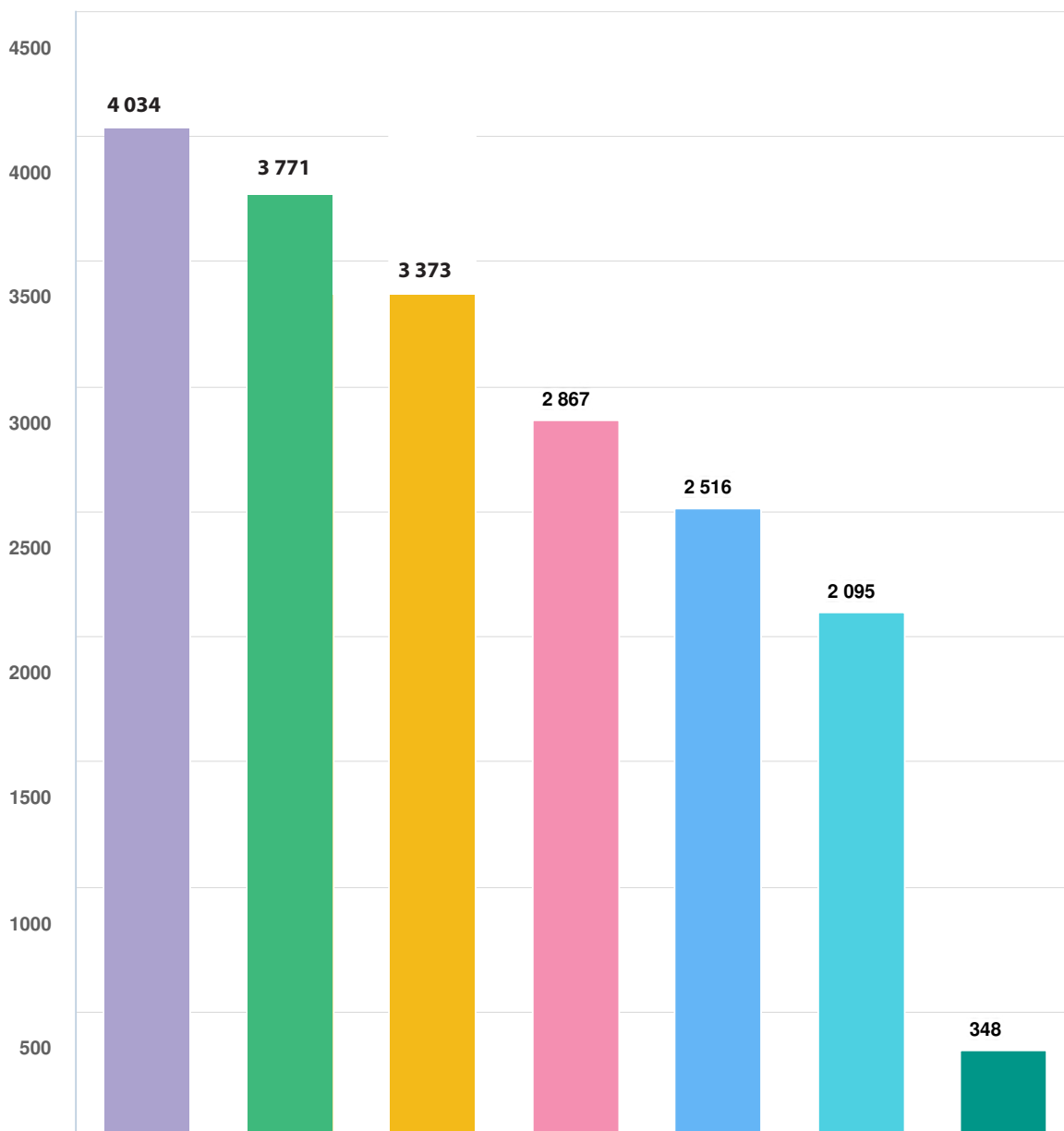

What would be the best way/s for the City to ensure physical distancing in recreation facilities?

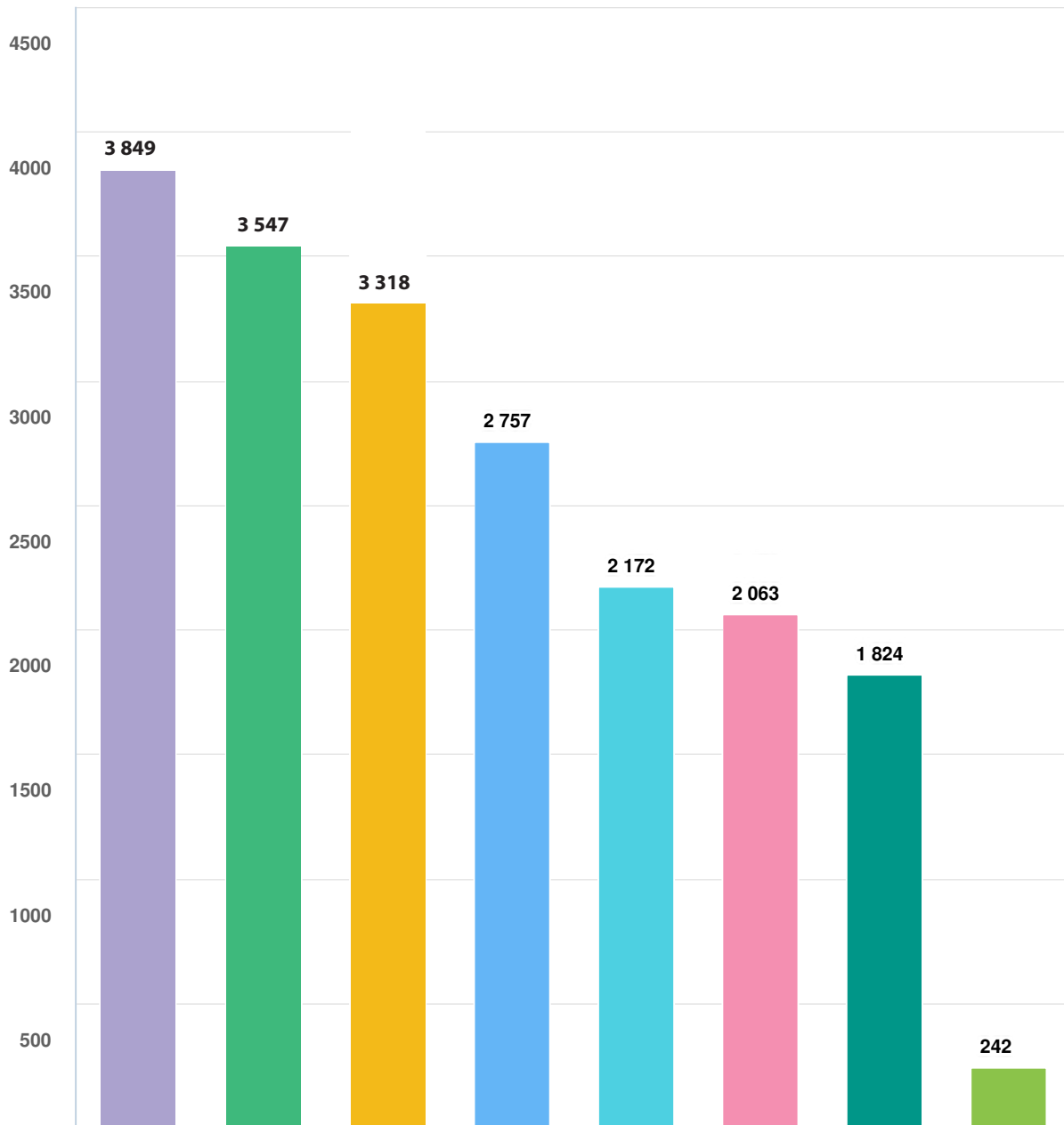


Question options Respondents were allowed to choose one or more options.

What would be the best way/s for the City to ensure physical distancing in libraries?

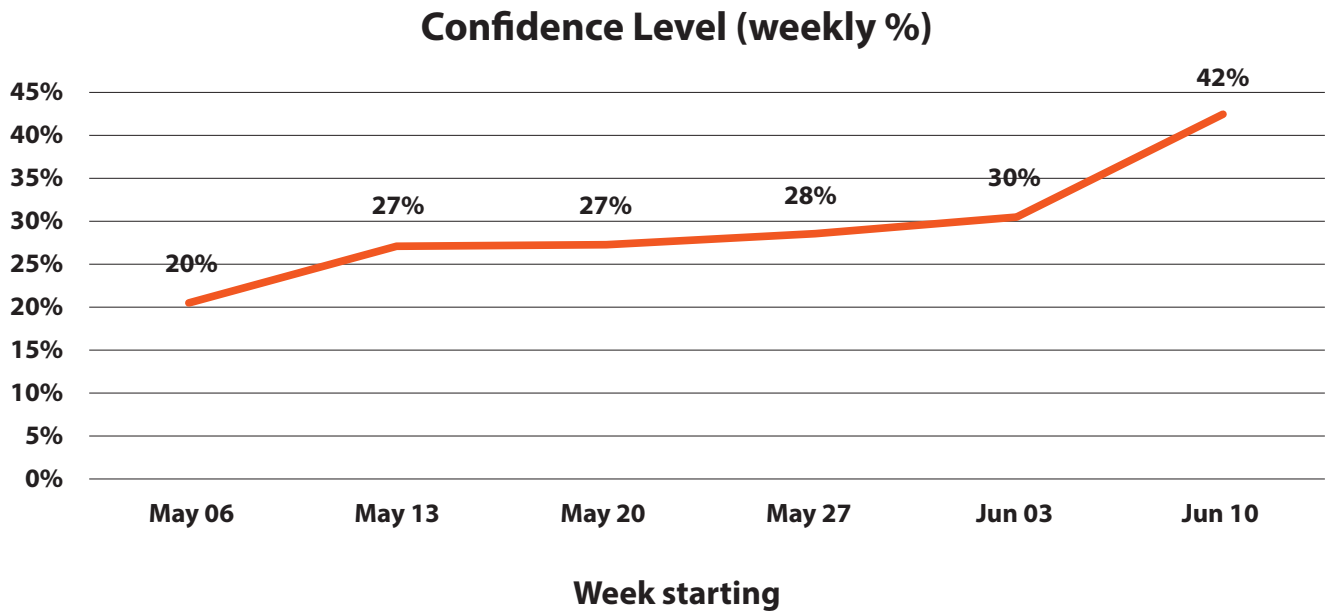


Question options Respondents were allowed to choose one or more options.

- Other (please specify)

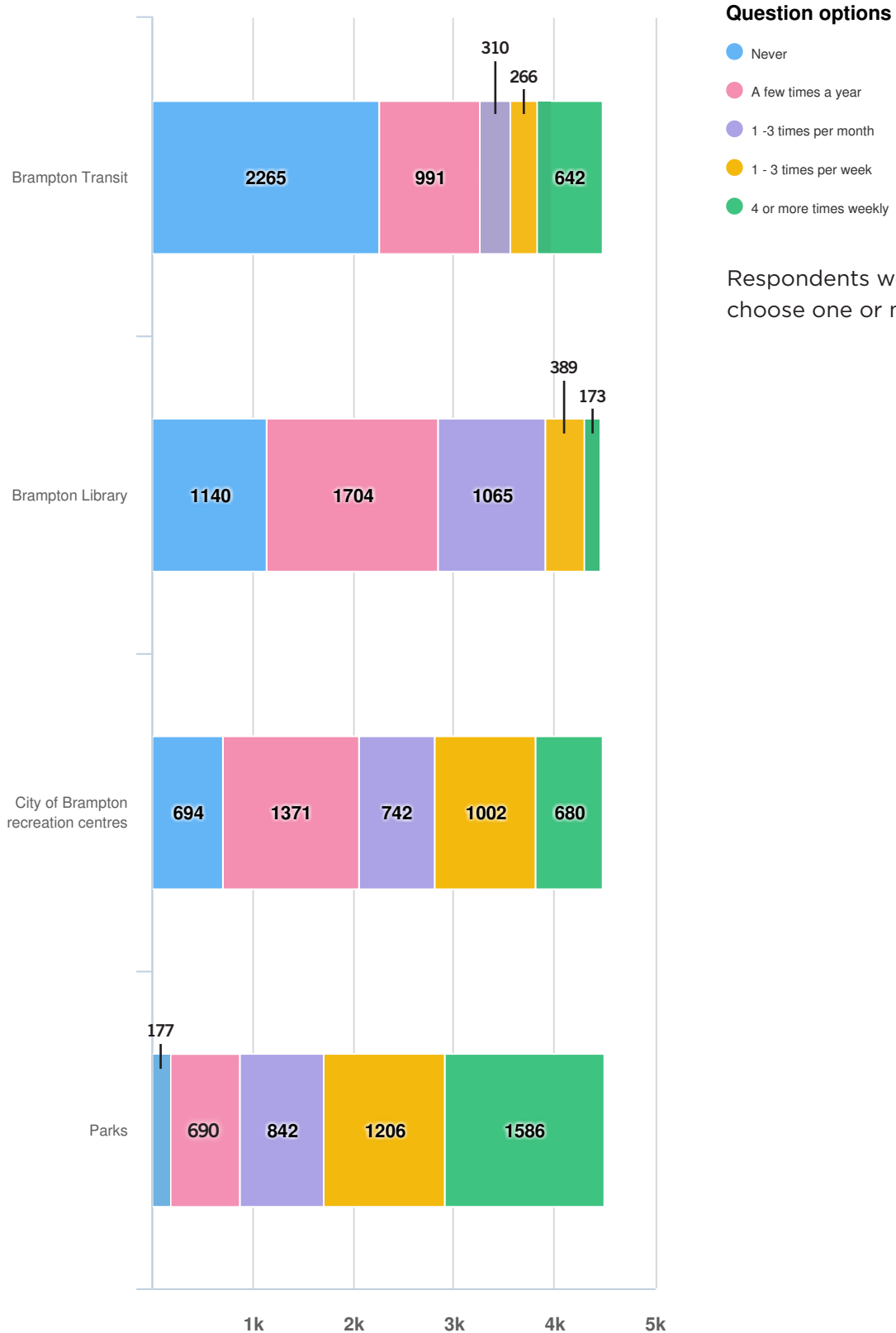
