Starting in 2005, he directed the Montreal All-Nighter. The rise of emerging music and digital arts as major factors in Montreal's cultural life led to other, more personal projects. In 2003, he founded the concept of the PIKNIC ÉLECTRONIK, where he was until recently the general director. That same year, he joined the MUTEK team, where he worked as production manager and in strategic development. In 2007, he launched Igloofest, a winter electronic music festival, in collaboration with

the Old Port of Montreal Corporation. All this work hasn't stopped him from getting involved with various other festivals and events. As part of these activities, he has been a member of the Comité arts et patrimoine at the Société de Transport de Montréal, and continues to sit on the Comité 360° of the Espace culturel Georges-Émile-Lapalme at Place des Arts.
