## Fête de Montréal: For the first year, it was love at first sight!

**Montreal, May 25 2011** – It was just a week ago, on May 17, when the Quartier des spectacles celebrated the Fête de Montréal for the first time by throwing a surprise party for locals and tourists. Despite the varied weather, 90 artists delivered almost 300 spontaneous performances, indoors and outside, across the Quartier des spectacles from Place des Arts to the Quartier Latin node.

At three different moments in the day between 7:30 AM and 5:30 PM, artists in the fields of music, fashion, theatre, dance, comedy, poetry, multimedia and the circus popped out and played for the love of their city. Some passersby, assuming that the performers were buskers, tried to throw a few coins into their hat. Others couldn't believe their eyes when they saw a fashion show or an opera recital kick off in the middle of the street. The lucky ones who caught an unexpected burst of cultural sunshine the middle of their day were delighted, as seen in the notes, photos and videos they posted on their social networks.
