Parti Pris Pluriel: The Quartier des Spectacles Partnership and the NFB team up to launch a call to creative artists in all media

Montreal, April 25, 2012 – The National Film Board of Canada (NFB) and the Quartier des Spectacles Partnership launch the PPP – Parti Pris Pluriel call for ideas. Artists are invited to submit a proposal for an interactive installation that will spark reflection on reconciling the individual and the collective, and that will transform the south wall of UQAM's President Kennedy Pavilion in Montreal through a unique blend of projected imagery and sound. Registration (required) is open from April 25 to May 30, and proposals can be submitted until noon, local time, on June 5, 2012, at www.partiprispluriel.org.

The call for ideas invites both experienced and emerging artists working in interactivity, media and visual arts, film, theatre, literature, video games, music, dance, design, architecture or any other discipline to submit a project that integrates projection and sound. The proposed concept should be primarily interactive, i.e. passersby should be able to participate in it and alter how it unfolds. The team or individual whose project is chosen will be in charge of creating the installation, which will be co-produced by the NFB and the Quartier des Spectacles Partnership next year. The production will receive a budget of \$250,000, and the launch of the work is slated for fall 2013.

"I agreed to be the spokesperson for the PPP - Parti Pris Pluriel project because I believe it is important and I think it will spawn vital reflection about public space. Can artists contribute to restoring the deeper significance of public places for the community? The question deserves the attention of us all," said François Girard, filmmaker, theatre director and PPP project jury chair.

The NFB and the Quartier des Spectacles Partnership are joining forces to support a creative installation that offers passersby an interactive and meaningful experience. As a leader in the production of interactive works, the NFB will guide the artist and provide an environment conducive to the execution of his or her idea, while taking it still further into innovative and unexplored creative areas. As a prime venue for cultural promotion in the heart of downtown Montreal, the Quartier des spectacles will ensure an exceptional degree of visibility for the work, connecting it with Montrealers and visitors from around the world.
