



MEGAPHONE: THE INTERACTIVE INSTALLATION THAT GIVES MONTREALERS A VOICE

Presented by the National Film Board of Canada and the Quartier des spectacles A Moment Factory creation staged by Étienne Paquette

Montreal, August 27, 2013 – From September 4 to November 4, pedestrians in the Quartier des spectacles can take part in an experience that's at once aural, visual and interactive—and the only one of its kind in the world. *Megaphone*, an installation about reappropriating public space, gives everyone an opportunity to join in on the discussion. As participants speak, their words will be transformed, in real time, into images projected onto the side of the President Kennedy building of Université du Québec à Montréal (UQAM), leaving their visual "footprint" on the urban landscape. Presented by the <u>National Film Board of Canada</u> and the **Quartier des spectacles**, *Megaphone* is a <u>Moment Factory</u> creation staged by Étienne Paquette.

Programming that gets people talking

Every evening from Wednesday to Saturday, various public figures and organizations will get the ball rolling by sharing their thoughts on a given topic. For an hour or two, these speakers will discuss various compelling subjects and prompt the public to join in. Audience members or passers-by can then have their say until *Megaphone* shuts down for the night (11 p.m. on Wednesdays and Thursdays, 1 a.m. on Fridays and Saturdays). An emcee will be on hand to moderate the discussion.

François Cardinal, Gabriel Nadeau-Dubois, DeAnne Smith, Yannick Nézet-Séguin, Rae Spoon, Mélissa Mollen Dupuis (Idle No More), Raoul Duguay and Les Zapartistes are just some of the speakers who have confirmed their participation in *Megaphone*. Various organizations will also sponsor certain evenings. Radio-Canada will host a verbal joust between Montreal's mayoral candidates on October 11; Equiterre, who will discuss several topics of current interest; *Le Devoir*, who will be hosting five special evenings based on the Montreal news scene; the Institut du Nouveau Monde will present a series of talks on participatory democracy; and École Urbania will preside over a weekly gathering entitled "Imagine Montreal," addressing themes such as transportation and food localism.

Let the people speak!

Megaphone was created as a mouthpiece to let Montrealers' voices be heard, loud and clear! Inspired by the city's early 20th-century history of popular assemblies as well as the 19th-century British tradition of the Speaker's Corner, **Megaphone** gives everyone a chance to speak out and air their concerns.

Public launch of Megaphone

"We're working to turn the Quartier des spectacles—the cultural heart of Montreal—into a unique open-air public space where we can show installations and works that make use of sophisticated technology, and treat people to something extraordinary. *Megaphone* is a perfect example. Capturing people's words and visually representating them in a downtown public space is something that has never been done, and it's a whole new way of bringing the Quartier to life. *Megaphone* allows everyone to participate, and generates discussion, putting technology to the best possible use: fostering interaction between individuals!" said Jacques Primeau, chairman of the board of the Partenariat du Quartier des spectacles.

"After Amsterdam, Park City and New York, the NFB and its Digital Studio, guided by Hugues Sweeney, are back in Montreal with an original work by Moment Factory. *Megaphone* taps into the collective memory of our great orators while serving as a powerful public platform that's anchored in today's realities. Produced with the Quartier des spectacles, the installation is totally innovative, putting a whole new spin on getting your voice heard," said Tom Perlmutter, Government Film Commissioner and Chairperson of the National Film Board of Canada.

"At Moment Factory, we like bringing people together in public spaces to experience something mindblowing. It's been a pleasure to work closely with the NFB and the Quartier des spectacles, who share our vision of urban space and who've given us this great playground for further exploring our notions of public participation. Creating an interactive installation is always a challenge. What really fired up the team about **Megaphone** was being able to push the boundaries and possibilities of voice recognition, a technology still in its infancy, by using it creatively," said Dominic Audet, co-founder of Moment Factory.

"Not only is the Mégaphone a delightful tribute to oral tradition in Quebec, it also helps us rediscover the democratic essence of public debate. This is the city that produced the Ligue Nationale d'Improvisation, making it practically inevitable that we would one day have this platform open to anyone with something to say. I want to congratulate everyone involved in creating the Mégaphone, which allows us to loudly proclaim our pride as Montrealers and as members this culturally rich, francophone, cosmopolitan community," said Élaine Ayotte, the Ville de Montréal's Executive Committee member responsible for culture, heritage and design.

The technology that makes Megaphone possible

Captured through a microphone installed on the Promenade des Artistes, the voices of *Megaphone* participants will affect the imagery projected onto UQAM's President Kennedy building, in real time. At the same time, the speaker's words will also be transferred to a voice-recognition system specially developed for *Megaphone* by the <u>Centre de recherche informatique de Montréal</u> (CRIM). A second, delayed transcription of the words will then be used to enhance the visual space as well as feed the database that informs the video content being projected when the megaphone is not in use. This will effectively reflect what has been said while providing an overall picture of the sound clips that have been stored.

Exhibition on the Promenade des Artistes

Megaphone also gives a nod to Quebec's history by paying homage to some of the province's greatest orators. An audiovisual exhibition will run along the Promenade des Artistes, highlighting the words and work of seven key figures: Pierre Bourgault, Clémence DesRochers, Camilien Houde, Michèle Lalonde, Gilles Vigneault, Kondiaronk and Irving Layton. In addition to being educational, the exhibition will also inspire anyone wishing to practise the art of oratory through **Megaphone**.
