

OUR VISION And Mission

VISION

To be a leader in permanent housing for adults with autism.

MISSION

The mission of the Véro & Louis Foundation is to create unique and permanent homes designed for the needs of autistic people 21 and over, with or without intellectual disabilities.

It's a social innovation project supported by various research projects that allow us to validate and improve its approach in real time. The Véro & Louis Home was built according to the world's best architectural practices to ensure an ideal physical environment for autistic residents.

The Véro & Louis Home is also a stimulating educational environment with a daily program designed for each autistic learner, whether they are residents or other adults still living with their families, to help them develop their potential and independence.

Before the Véro & Louis Home opened its doors, the services available to autistic people 21 and over were very limited in some communities and non-existent in others.



The wait for long-term housing can be as long as 11 years.

Although studies on ageing with autism have almost quadrupled in the last few years, they only account for 1% of all published research on autism.

WHAT IS AUTISM?

Autism spectrum disorder (ASD) is a part of a large umbrella of neurodevelopmental disorders. It affects the development of communication and social skills and the individual's behaviours, activities and interests, which can be highly focused or repetitive in nature. Autism is for life.

Unfortunately, long-term housing resources for autistic adults

21 and over are precarious where they even exist. Not only are placement wait times unreasonable, but the available housing is not always designed for the needs of autistic adults. Changing this reality is at the heart of our mission.

THE VÉRO & LOUIS HOME IN ACTION



FIRST ANNIVERSARY OF THE VÉRO & LOUIS HOME IN VARENNES - MAY 2022

One year after officially opening its doors, the Véro & Louis Home in Varennes is fulfilling its promises. It's now home to 16 autistic adults whose ages range from 22 to 61. Supported by the public health system, this housing model gives residents a place to develop their potential and independence. The objective is, and has always been, to replicate this model in other regions of Quebec to address a major need.

A VEGETABLE GARDEN GIFTED BY DESJARDINS - SUMMER 2022

Thanks to the dedicated work of the Home staff over summer 2022, residents had the opportunity to garden and watch their plants grow, maintain the garden area and help harvest the results of their efforts.

We thank Desjardins, especially the Caisse Desjardins des Patriotes, for sponsoring our gardening accessories and providing the financial support to make this wonderful garden possible!

OPENING OF THE SOCIO-PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITY CENTRE - FALL 2022

In collaboration with CISSS de la Montérégie-Est, the Véro & Louis Home in Varennes set up an on-site educational and socio-professional activity centre in fall 2022. Planned and led by specialized educators, the educational activities have the following objectives:

- Develop the cognitive, emotional, and physical potential of participants and increase their independence throughout their lifetimes
- Give the participants who still live with their birth families the opportunity to continue learning throughout adulthood in an educational activity centre designed for their needs

Some of our most popular activities:

- **Correspondence Project:** Corresponding with family members including extended family (grandparents, aunts and uncles, siblings) to maintain connections.
- **Cooking Project:** Preparing different foods to make snacks for themselves and other participants and independently following recipes while adhering to good health and hygiene practices.
- **Gardening Project:** Participating in the different steps of setting up a garden, such as preparing the seeds, watering, transplanting, companion planting, preparing the soil and planting the garden while following an established plan.
- **Daily tasks:** Helping maintain the living space throughout the day with tasks such as setting the table, vacuuming after an activity, cleaning the tables, etc.
- **Regular library visits:** Story time activities led by youth facilitator Ms. Suzanne. The participants borrow books for personal use or for interactive reading sessions provided at the Home.
- Led board game activities: Games to develop communication skills.
- **Walking Club:** The club counts their kilometres walked to reach an imagined destination. The main objectives are to stay in shape, reduce sedentary behaviour and build endurance. Current destination: Mexico. A Mexican fiesta awaits at their destination!
- **Geography activity:** Opening up to the world around us. Participants get to know the neighbourhood and our city's nearby businesses. This activity includes a passport project for participants to learn about the continents and countries.
- **Health and well-being evening:** Foot and hand treatments in a spa ambiance with relaxing music and aromatherapy. Participants are also offered massages and face treatments.











RESIDENTS' PROGRESS: ACTIONS WITH A REAL IMPACT

The Véro & Louis Home provides a unique environment for its residents to learn each day with support from a team of specialized educators and dedicated resident attendants. Here are just some examples of the incredible progress residents have made.

Cooking

While there is an on-site cook to prepare their meals, the residents are the ones responsible for making all the snacks! Some residents practice their motor skills cutting vegetables and learn simple recipes to make smoothies. Other residents with more autonomy learn to prepare different snacks completely on their own using visual recipes and equipment set aside for their use. They make raspberry bread, zucchini muffins, oatmeal cookies and various other snacks to share with their roommates and the staff.

Household tasks

As it is their home, the residents learn to take care of their living spaces alongside their roommates. A number of the residents have learned to do their laundry, tidy up their rooms and the common areas, fold and put away towels and even weed the garden!

Each resident is responsible for a task at mealtimes, and the tasks rotate each week. Whether they're filling or emptying the dishwasher, vacuuming after the meal or wiping the tables, everyone contributes. The staff provide support with these tasks as needed, but are needed less and less!

Socializing

While autistic people have difficulty with social interactions, the residents of the Véro & Louis Home are getting to know each other at their own pace and in their own ways. Every Wednesday evening there is a social skills activity, where the residents chat about certain topics, practice their skills and build friendships. The residents look forward to this workshop and make notable progress, especially with regard to respecting others' personal space, spontaneous questions between roommates, and choosing to do activities or share meals with the other residents.

Communication

One resident did not communicate at all when she arrived at the Véro & Louis Home and needed encouragement from the staff to gesture. Now she uses gestures for "help me," "attach" and "finish" and points to express her needs. She also makes sounds that allow her to communicate when she needs help or wants to bring something to the staff's attention.



"Something that I never would have expected, which is so positive and wonderful to see, is the camaraderie developing with the other residents. [...] There's a social aspect where she's making great strides.

"There's also her independence, which I find is really growing. She is starting to be able to do her laundry entirely on her own."

The Véro & Louis Foundation is proud to contribute to advancing knowledge on autism. In 2022, the Véro & Louis Foundation coordinated the development of four research projects at the Véro & Louis Home in Varennes and shared its experience and expertise in external projects. One such project was "Quality in Canada's Built Environment: Roadmaps to Equity, Social Value and Sustainability" funded by the SSHRC, for which the Foundation reported on the unique needs of autistic people.

Progress	Online training was created for positive behaviour support (PBS) in the Véro & Louis Home context and was evaluated by new staff in 2022. The Université de Sherbrooke team transferred their knowledge on behaviour observation and running the PBS committee to the team at the Véro & Louis Home. Finally, the residents' family members attended an information session on PBS.



Administrator


