GARBAGE ACCEPTED FOR CURBSIDE SERVICE

- ✓ Garbage you generate inside your home on a regular basis, which is not considered recyclable or hazardous
- ✓ Bathroom, kitchen, bedroom & laundry room garbage
- ✓ Candy wrappers, straws, siran wrap, food contaminated tinfoil/containers
- ✓ Light bulbs (not fluorescent)
- ✓ Small amounts of clothing (1 or 2 items per bag)
- ✓ Photographs
- ✓ Used tissues and paper towels
- ✓ Diapers
- ✓ Vacuum cleaner bags
- ✓ Food waste
- ✓ Small amounts of kitty litter
- ✓ Broken glass wrapped in newspaper (safety reasons)
- ✓ Broken glasses, cups, ceramic dishes, plates
- ✓ *Yard Waste & Leaves, but only during specific dates advertised*

GARBAGE ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED AT THE CURB

- ✗ *Needles & sharps (return to the pharmacy)*
- ✗ *Hazardous waste (batteries, paint, cleaners, etc)*
- ✗ Pots & pans
- ✗ Large Toys
- ✗ Small appliances (crockpots, toaster ovens, tea kettles, etc)
- ✗ Outdoor yard items (hoses, tools etc)
- ✗ Bags full of linens, clothes or footwear
- ✗ Wine & spirit containers (please return them to the LCBO & get your deposit back)
- ✗ Construction material
- ✗ Demolition material
- ✗ Scrap metal
- ✗ Electronics

Do not place these items in with your curbside garbage.

Guidelines:

Each bag of household garbage placed out for collection must be tied & have a valid Town bag tag attached to it. Tags must be visible to the collector; do not attach tags to your garbage can. Bag tags are \$2.50 each and can be purchased at Town Hall, Home Hardware, Metro & White's Grocery. There is 4 bag limit per week, per household. Bags set out for collection must be at the curb no later than 7:00am and visible to the driver. Placing your bags out later than 7:00am means you could miss the truck and have to wait until the following week to have your bags collected.

Alternate Disposal Options:

-Large items that are not recyclable and are at the end of their life cycle must be transported to a waste transfer station out of town. The Town does not have a transfer station or landfill site. Gently used clothing can be donated to thrift stores such as The Salvation Army, Value Village, Bibles for Missions, Talize, Canadian Diabetes Clothesline or March of Dimes.
