#### Town of Gananoque Invasive Plant Update – 13 Sep 2025 – Alan Smith

# Invasive plants observed in Gananoque park and trail areas

McLean Forest: Goutweed, Periwinkle, Dog Strangling Vine, Lily of the Valley, Honeysuckle, Buckthorn, Coltsfoot, Purple Loosestrife, Garlic Mustard.

Lions (Rail) Trail: Garlic Mustard, Coltsfoot, Phragmites.

Grasshopper Park: Phragmites, Purple Loosestrife.

Machar Park: Honeysuckle, periwinkle, Lily of the valley.

Confederation Park: Purple Loosestrife, Japanese Knotweed, Black Locust.

Arena Park: Black Locust, Buckthorn,

Steelworkers Park: Flowering Rush, Purple Loosestrife.

Rotary Beach / Bay Rd: Purple Loosestrife, Japanese Knotweed, Day Lily, goutweed.

Joel Stone Park: Japanese Knotweed.

Stocking Hill Creek: Purple Loosestrife, Phragmites.

Kinsman Park: Phragmites, Japanese Knotweed.

Rogers Trail: Honeysuckle, Buckthorn, Japanese Knotweed.

Narrows/Snapper Loop: Honeysuckle, Buckthorn, Coltsfoot.

Riverside Loop: Honeysuckle, Buckthorn, Maidengrass.

Notably not found: Himalayan Balsam, Giant Hogweed, Wild Parsnip, Yellow Iris, Tree of Heaven.

\* Based on observations of obvious troublesome invasive plants. Not all plants identified merit control measures.

### **Recent progress**

Contract awarded for chemical control of Japanese Knotweed in Joel Stone and Kinsmen parks, and on Bay Rd (Chemical control is the only viable control method for these infestations).

The Rotary Club assisted by Trees and Trails members has completed their first few invasive plant cleanups, with intentions to continue in again in Spring 2026. Manual controls have included:

- Phragmites in Grasshopper Park (cutting)
- Goutweed and Periwinkle in McLean Forest (smothering)
- Dog Strangling Vine in McLean Forest (cutting)
- Garlic Mustard in McLean Forest (pulling)
- Purple Loosestrife in McLean Forest and Grasshopper Park (seed removal)

Council approval of installation of two FABN funded bootbrush stations at McLean Forest (seed spread prevention)

#### Suggested future actions

Continued manual control events by insured volunteers from Rotary Club.

The Town of Gananoque applies through CRCA for the 2026 grant for chemical control of Phragmites, with target infestations at Stocking Hill Creek, Grasshopper Park, Lions Trail and John Street (east end).
