A look back...

OUR HISTORY

Roots and wings: from the fur trade to the F-35

The present-day city of Cold Lake sits on land that had been rich grounds for hunting, fishing, trapping, and gathering by First Nations peoples for centuries. It was the fur trade that first brought Europeans to the region.

The Hudson's Bay Company established a trading post, Cold Lake House, on the banks of the Beaver River in 1790. From this post the HBC did commerce with the local Dene Suline (Denesųfiné) people.

Settlement by Canadian and European newcomers began in earnest in the late 19th century. The Roman Catholic church encouraged Frenchspeaking settlers to homestead in the area during the years following the Northwest Rebellion of 1885, and the Canadian government offered land across Western Canada to homesteaders in the early 20th century.

Many local families are direct descendants of these first settlers.

EARLY TOURISM

The beauty of the region and its appeal as a getaway destination were immediately apparent. Paul Jeanrichard, a Swiss immigrant known locally as "P.J. Richard," was among those who opened stores and guest cabins to serve residents and visitors in the years before World War I. In the 1920s, Jim Hoolahan created a small tourist village of six two-storey buildings on the lakeshore where the M.D. of Bonnyville's Cold Lake campground now sits.


Hoolahan actively promoted Cold Lake as a tourist destination, creating Cold Lake Beach pennants and humorous illustrated postcards depicting enormous fish.

The Alberta record lake trout, at 52 ½ pounds, was caught by one Mrs. Erickson, a guest at Hoolahan's resort in 1929. That record still stands.

A commercial fishery also thrived on Cold Lake, with local merchants shipping fish from Cold Lake to destinations in Canada and the United States. W.O. (Bill) Clark exported fish and operated a general store, which is now a popular lakeshore restaurant.

CFB COLD LAKE

With the onset of the Cold War after World War II, the Canadian government designated a large area north of Cold Lake as an air weapons range and established RCAF Station Cold Lake in 1954.



The arrival of thousands of military personnel and their families spurred population growth and commercial expansion in the nearby town of Grand Centre, which was located between the village of Cold Lake and the RCAF Station.

Grand Centre, Cold Lake, and the air base have since amalgamated to form the present-day City of Cold Lake.

Canadian Forces Base Cold Lake is home to 4 Wing, the RCAF's largest fighter formation. The Wing presently comprises three CF-18 squadrons, a combat support helicopter squadron, and several other support units.

The establishment of the air weapons range in the 1950s displaced approximately 350 Indigenous families who had depended on that land for their livelihood. A land claim was finally adjudicated in 1994, and Cold Lake First Nations invested the settlement to create Primco Dene – a company with diverse industrial and commercial holdings and one of the region's largest employers.

OIL SANDS DEVELOPMENT

The energy sector drives the recent economic history of the region. In the 1960s, Imperial Oil began testing in-situ extraction of bitumen from oil sands, and by 1975 had its Leming Point extraction plant in production.

Today the industry supports thousands of jobs

and attracts investment in infrastructure and technology. Environmental considerations and community engagement are increasingly important, and the industry is invested in reducing carbon footprints and enhancing sustainability.

VISITING COLD LAKE

I Spy:

SOME LANDMARKS AND POINTS OF INTEREST IN COLD LAKE

As you walk, ride, or drive around Cold Lake you will pass some notable landmarks and some more commonplace sights. As you really get to know our city, you will be able to check these places and things off the list.

TOTEMS: Two totem poles are pretty easy to find. Do you know where to find a third one?

GATEWAY TO A GRAND HISTORY: A commemorative gateway preserves the name of one of Cold Lake's original communities.

LIVING HISTORY: One of Cold Lake's oldest commercial buildings, originally a place to buy general goods and a clearing house for exporting fish, is still operating – but as a different business.

DISASTER AT SEA? Cold Lake has many neighbourhood parks. One has a name that (sort of) suggests an ill-fated ocean voyage.

FIGHTER-ON-A-STICK: We proudly display our RCAF history. Can you identify the two jets on

display near a major intersection? Do you know where to look for more aircraft you can see up close?

CITY OF SAILS: How many sails can you spot on boats, in displays, on signs?

HONOURING TOM: Thomas Varughese was an athlete, educator, and builder who inspired Cold Lake with his love of soccer. Visit the beautiful facility that bears his name.

CHECK THE HALL: Tom is also one of the people commemorated in the Cold Lake Hall of Fame, not far from the facility mentioned above.

THE BIG BALL ON THE SKYLINE: With a 30-foot diameter, it's been called "the big golf ball."

MAKE A SPLASH: Kids in Cold Lake beat the heat at two separate splash parks. Try them both!

COMMUNITY FOREST: In the late 1990s the local government planted a variety of trees – partly to have on hand for transplant, but mainly to create a shaded space for the public to enjoy. Where is it?

PUBLIC ART: Historic murals blend into the cityscape and blur the boundary between old and new. How many can you find?

GO FISH: Fish symbolism is strong in Cold Lake, often in reference to the legendary Kinosoo. How many fish can you spot around town?

WHICH WILL YOU DO FIRST?

It's easy to find exciting, fascinating, and fun things to see and do in Cold Lake. The hard part is deciding where to start.

Whatever you love to do, you're bound to find something here that excites you. And there's always new experiences for you to try.

Here's a partial list of the ways you can make the most of your visit

- 1. LAUNCH YOUR BOAT:** Explore the lake and its shorelines, or enjoy family fun waterskiing and tubing.
- 2. CATCH A FISH:** Cast from shore or from your canoe, kayak, or motorboat. There's walleye, pan fish like perch, and lunkers like lake trout and northern pike to be caught.
- 3. LOOK UP (PART I):** Take a short drive away

from the city's lights and take in the incredible northern sky. Stars, galaxies, meteors, satellites and of course the awe-inspiring Northern Lights put on an amazing show.

4. LOOK UP (PART II): RCAF 4 Wing Cold Lake is famous as home base for the CF-18 Hornet fighter, and 417 Combat Support Squadron flies the CH-146 Griffon helicopter. Other military and civilian-operated aircraft can often be seen coming and going from the base.

5. LOOK UP (PART III): Nothing beats the excitement of the Cold Lake International Air Show, held every second year.

6. ENJOY A LOCAL FESTIVAL: Cold Lake loves to celebrate! Find out what's happening while you're in town. Celebrations include Snow Fever Festival, Canada Day, Aqua Days, Cold Lake Air Show and Full Throttle Festival, Feast At The Beach, and more.

7. LACE 'EM UP (INDOORS): Skating facilities at Cold Lake Energy Centre and the North Arena offer opportunities for public skating or casual shinny. There is also public skating time at 4 Wing's Col JJ Parr Recreation Centre.

8. LACE 'EM UP (OUTDOORS): There are outdoor rinks in neighbourhoods around town. But for a classic Canadian experience, go for a skate on some open lake ice.

9. STRAP 'EM ON (ALPINE): Kinosoo Ridge winter resort has 14 ski runs including four Easy runs and two Black Diamond, with a variety of intermediate runs in between.

10. STRAP 'EM ON (NORDIC): Local volunteers keep cross-country ski trails in good shape. Cold Lake Provincial Park trails range from flat on the lake ice to more challenging.

11. TAKE A SLIDE: Snow + a toboggan + gravity make for hours of outdoor winter fun.

12. TAKE A HIKE OR GO FOR A WALK: Quiet residential streets, attractive parks, and rustic trails invite exploration.

13. WALK YOUR DOG: Wherever you're walking, it's more fun with your best buddy alongside. For more of a romp, visit the off-leash dog park at the Energy Centre.

14. CAPTURE THE SCENE: Take your camera, sketchbook, or easel on your explorations. Local

artists find endless inspiration in Cold Lake's many vistas.

15. TAKE A SWIM (OUTDOORS): The sun-warmed shallows of Kinosoo Beach and Cold Lake's other natural beaches offer a cooling dip on a hot day.

16. TAKE A SWIM (INDOORS): Pools at local hotels and the Col JJ Parr Recreation Centre are there to help with personal fitness or family fun.

17. SEARCH FOR BIRDS: Cold Lake is one of the best birding sites in Alberta. Waterfowl and shorebirds, raptors and songbirds – including 22 species of warbler – live here seasonally or year-round.

18. PLAY A ROUND: There are two picturesque and challenging 18-hole golf courses close by, each offering clubhouse and pro shop services.

19. HURRY HARD: Cold Lake Curling Club welcomes curlers for its leagues, open bonspiels, and casual curling.

20. KNOCK 'EM DOWN: Bowling isn't just for birthday parties! The great Canadian five-pin game is fun for everyone and a great test of skill.

21. SHOP 'TIL YOU DROP: Familiar retailers and unique shops await!

22. VISIT A FARM: Local agri-tourism opportunities abound! Fresh local food and other products, and an opportunity to meet some friendly farm animals up close.



23. CELEBRATE HOMEMADE: Regular farmers' markets and frequent pop-up vendor markets are your stops for "Make It, Bake It, Grow It" goods.

24. GRAB A QUICK BITE: Your favourite restaurant brands are here, as well as some great local independents.

25. RESERVE A TABLE: Seek out Cold Lake's one-of-a-kind fine dining experiences!

26. CATCH A CONCERT: There's live music at outdoor events, in bars and clubs, and in concert settings all year round.

27. SING A SONG: Some local spots have open mic and karaoke nights if you've got a song in your heart.

28. WATCH A PLAY: An accomplished community theatre troupe stages original theatre productions in a variety of intimate venues.

29. WATCH A MOVIE: The cinema in town, with five screens, offers a good selection of current movies.

30. TAKE IN A GAME: There's plenty of hockey, football, soccer, softball, baseball, and more. Check out the Cold Lake Ice Junior "B" hockey and Cold Lake Fighter Jets senior football teams!

31. FIND A GOOD BOOK: Bookstores, newsstands, thrift shops, and two public library branches offer plenty to read. Take a stack of novels to the beach and settle in.

32. SPEAKING OF THRIFT: Cold Lake has plenty

of thrift stores, vintage clothing consignment, and antique shops for treasure hunters.

33. MORE TREASURE: Look for garage sales, yard sales, and charity fundraisers every weekend through the summer.

34. WAVE A FLAG: You can't beat Canada Day in Cold Lake! Kinosoo Beach is party central for the parade, ceremonies, music, food, and a spectacular CF-18 flypast.

35. COWBOY UP: Watch for chuckwagon races, rodeos, and bull-riding competitions throughout the year.

36. VISIT OUR PAST: Cold Lake Museums' four galleries – Air Force, Indigenous, Oil and Gas, and Heritage – tell the many stories of the region and its people.

37. EXPOSE YOURSELF TO ART: Cold Lake is decorated with several colourful murals and other public artworks. It's not hard to find an original by famous Dëne Sųłiné artist Alex Janvier in public buildings around town.

38. HIT THE TRAIL: Go off road and discover the region from one of our many trails, including the famous Iron Horse Trail.

39. HIT ANOTHER TRAIL: Our mountain bike trails and the adjoining bike park give you an exciting workout over diverse terrain.

40. CHECK YOUR CALENDAR: Plan your next visit. We'll be expecting you!

COLD LAKE

We love our lake!

“Is Cold Lake really cold?”

The sun-warmed shallow water along our shoreline is perfectly suitable for a refreshing swim in the summertime, as thousands of beachgoers will attest.

But we call it Cold Lake for a reason: it’s a big,

deep lake fed mostly by cold underground aquifers. Just a few metres below the surface, the water can be numbingly cold. This helps to limit algae growth and contributes to the pristine clarity of the water.

The lake, which straddles the Alberta-Saskatchewan border, covers approximately 373 square kilometres and is almost 100 metres (325 feet) deep. It is fed from the north by the Medley and Martineau Rivers and drains to the east via Cold River.

The water eventually enters the Churchill River, flowing northeast to Hudson Bay.





FISHING

With its warm shallows and frigid depths, Cold Lake provides habitat for 24 species of fish. Sport fishing draws anglers to the lake and the community all year round.

In fact, the biggest lake trout ever caught in Alberta was reeled in by one Mrs. Erickson in 1929, weighing 52 pounds 8 ounces. While that record has stood for almost a hundred years, there are still plenty of large lake trout and big battlesome northern pike to be caught.


The lake's reputation for big fish is many centuries old. The Cree story of the *Kinosoo* – a

fish so big it bit a man's canoe in half – is well known locally. The Dëne Sųłné equivalent is the story of *Łuechok*, meaning "big fish," and the Dene still refer to the lake as *Łuechok Tűe*: Big Fish Lake.

Cold Lake is host to two major fishing tournaments, one in each summer and winter. But for more casual anglers, there are countless places on the lake to catch fish as you drift in your boat or cast from shore.

Alberta and Saskatchewan sportfishing licences are recognized on Cold Lake; Alberta regulations apply.

COLD LAKE MARINA

Cold Lake is home to Western Canada's largest inland marina, with more than 230 slips and 20 large storage lockers for canoes, kayaks, and paddleboards. For transient users, the marina has a dual boat launch with fuel sales, and nearby parking for vehicles and boat trailers.

There is a restaurant on site, or you can enjoy an easy stroll to enjoy the services and attractions along Cold Lake's lakeshore.

BOATING

With almost 400 square kilometres of surface area, Cold Lake is a boater's paradise. There's plenty to explore from the water. Cold Lake's 99-kilometre shoreline touches on sandy beaches, tall cliffs, reedy wetlands and impressive boulders. Most of the water's edge is unpopulated, giving you great opportunities



for spotting wildlife or enjoying a picnic lunch on a secluded beach.

For motorboat enthusiasts, there are public boat launches at Cold Lake Marina, Cold Lake Provincial Park, the M.D. of Bonnyville French Bay Campground, and the English Bay Provincial Recreation area.

The open water can offer some great winds for sailing. Cold Lake Sailing Club has small boats for lessons, and twice a week the members let out the spinnakers on their larger craft for thrilling sail races.

Canoeists and kayakers love the sheltered waters of French Bay and Long Bay for paddling, floating, fishing, and wildlife watching. It is not uncommon to see hundreds of birds, or to catch a glimpse of mammals large and small while quietly gliding across the water's surface.

OUTDOORS

4 SEASONS PLAYGROUND

Cold Lake is your four-season playground!

Hot days at the beach, cool days on the water, or brilliant sunny days in the snow – Cold Lake is where you want to be for outdoor recreation.

KINOSOO BEACH

Kinosoo Beach is Cold Lake's gathering place all summer long. With expansive lawns and golden sand, it attracts locals and visitors to enjoy swimming, sports, picnics, and relaxing down time.

Pick up a game of beach volleyball on one of two beach volleyball courts or shoot some hoops in the multi-purpose court. A large set of playground equipment keeps active and entertained.

The stage area sees frequent use for major events like Canada Day, Aqua Days, and the annual fall Feast At The Beach; you might also catch a community performance by the RCAF 4 Wing military band.

Young people might be content with a shovel and pail or a dip in the lake, but the zip line

into the water and the big colourful splash park offer extra excitement.

Kinosoo Beach was named "Project of the Year" in 2018 by the Alberta Public Works Association for the planning and layout of its amenities and enhancements. Canadian Geographic magazine considers it to be one of Canada's Top 25 Beaches.

SPLASH PARKS

Cold Lake is home to two great cool-down spots for our hot summer days. One of course is the Kinosoo Beach splash park, with its "big fish" themed fountains. The other is the splash park at Col JJ Parr Recreation Centre on 4 Wing. That one has a fun and unmistakable aviation theme.

KINOSOO RIDGE

Kinosoo Ridge Resort was first established as a ski facility, but the Municipal District of Bonnyville has expanded its offerings to include unique summertime experiences. The most striking feature is the four-storey-high Aerial Adventure Park. The structure offers more than 40 different climbing challenges where you can literally elevate yourself 60 feet from ground level.

If you'd rather leave the climbing to other family members, you can use the time to tune up your golf game at the target range. Ten tee boxes give you the opportunity to improve your distance and accuracy as you aim for targets set at varying distances.



But wintertime is snow time at Kinosoo Ridge! Four easy, eight intermediate, and two black diamond ski and snowboard runs ensure there is a variety of challenges. The resort also has a tube park, and a terrain park suitable for learners or advanced skiers and boarders. If you're new to alpine sports or need a refresher, lessons are available for all ages. And The Ridge, a licensed dining facility, has a great selection of seasonal fare all year round for sit-down meals or a quick bite.

MOUNTAIN BIKE PARK

If you love fun and adventure on two wheels, check out Cold Lake Mountain Bike Park on Radar Hill.

At the centre of the park is a layout with a progressive series of jumps for cyclists from beginner to advanced levels. A flow line along the north side of the layout combines berms, rollers, and tabletops for fun riding.

From the central layout, riders can head onto seven kilometres of trails, ranging from a beginner loop to an advanced section. The vertical range of the trail system is 27 metres, within which there are 89 metres – almost 300 feet – of total descent.

And mountain biking isn't just a summertime activity: in winter, the trails and course are groomed for "fat bike" riders to take up the challenges.

The park was designed by renowned mountain biker Jay Hoots. His company, Hoots Ltd,

has designed and built dozens of first-class mountain bike facilities from Tofino to Toronto.

GOLF

If golf is your passion, Cold Lake has two 18-hole courses – why not play both?

The Cold Lake Golf & Winter Club, located on Canadian Forces Base Cold Lake, is City-operated and accessible to the public.

The course was originally built by military volunteers in 1957 and has undergone considerable expansion and improvement from its original nine-hole configuration, living up to its nickname as "The Jewel of the North." Today the course is a 6,573-yard, par 72 layout with a driving range. The scenic 16th, 17th, and 18th holes may well be the best three finishing holes in northeastern Alberta.

The clubhouse includes a well-stocked pro shop, and the lounge opens onto a beautiful second-storey balcony. For tee times or tournament bookings, visit coldlake.com. Grand Centre Golf and Country Club was established in 1961. At 6,497 yards, the par 72 course is beautifully constructed and maintained.

The course, billed as "The Premier Golf Course in the Lakeland," was designed to be accessible for players of all ability levels, while still offering experienced golfers plenty of challenges. The 4th hole (par 4) and the 14th hole (par 5) are player favourites for their scenic beauty and their technical demands.

BIRDS AND WILDLIFE

If you want to see birds and other animals, a big body of water on the edge of the great boreal forest is a great place to start looking. Nearly 300 bird species have been recorded here including year-round, seasonal, and transient birds. The woods come alive with

22 species of warbler every spring, and Cold Lake's bays and shorelines are home to dozens of varieties of shorebirds and waterfowl. American white pelicans, graceful on the water or in the air, are easily spotted.

Watch the skies and the trees for eagles, owls, hawks, and other raptors. The "show" changes throughout the year, you'll want to come back often.

It's always exciting to catch sight of whitetail deer, mule deer, moose, and (less commonly) elk – especially if you're lucky enough to see them up close. Watch open fields and creek beds if travelling by land; if you're in a canoe or other boat, keep an eye on the shoreline for moose feeding on the tender water plants. But smaller animals are fun and fascinating. Frogs and minnows are easy to catch and observe before setting them free. A pailful of lake water might contain freshwater crustaceans, water beetles, and other cool critters. And while the tiny animals aren't exactly majestic, there are half a dozen species of colourful caterpillars and some bright, speedy tiger beetles that are worth looking for. All kinds of fur-bearing animals and small predators are bound to show themselves, if only fleetingly.

And of course black bears make their home in the region. They are beautiful animals, but it's

important to keep a respectful distance and to be "bear-aware" when in their habitat.

TRAILS

There's plenty to see even from the highway and the city's streets. But if you want to see the Lakeland up close, it's easy to park your car and hit the trail.

There are hundreds of footpaths, cutlines and clearings to take you closer to the sights and sounds of nature. Even better, Cold Lake is connected to maintained trails that will deliver you to places you won't see from the highway. The Iron Horse Trail offers 300 kilometres of former rail bed, suitable for travel by off-highway vehicles and snowmobiles, cyclists, or on horseback. The trail is a wonder in itself, taking you past scenery that changes from one kilometre to the next, and from one season to another.

The Millenium Trail is a paved pathway that connects Cold Lake's neighbourhoods, and an easy way to get away from car traffic while out for a run, walk or bike ride.

From the lakeshore, through parkland and wooded stands, past ponds and fields and safely through the heart of the city, the trail finally passes through CFB Cold Lake's attractive Heritage Park and the Cold Lake Golf & Winter Club course on its way onto the base.

The trail is fully accessible for people with disabilities and is off limits for motorized vehicles except for electric mobility aids. There are also 11 kilometres of trails to take hikers, bikers, and skiers through Cold Lake Provincial Park.

The wide dirt trails connect starting points like the Provincial Park beach, the boat launch, or the campgrounds with the many landforms and wildlife habitats in the park. The entire trail system can be easily portioned into shorter routes.

The scenic path will take you past cliffs overlooking the water and into shaded areas of aspen, birch, and spruce forest. There are places where hikers can access the rocky shore, and lookout points over places of particular interest.

SNOWMOBILING AND CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING

In wintertime volunteers groom tracks in the Provincial Park for classic and skate-style cross-country skiing, with some beginner-friendly trails and some more suitable for advanced skiers.

Some of these tracks are on the lake itself, which is also popular for snowmobilers. Think of sledding as hard-water boating – the expansive lake and its variable shoreline features can make for a beautiful day's ride. The Iron Horse Trail is maintained for sledding in the wintertime, and there are other snowmobiling opportunities off of the designated trails. As always, respect nature and respect private property.



ARTS CULTURE, AND HISTORY

Museums

History is a living thing. The past isn't permanent and frozen, it grows with every passing moment. And as it grows, it adds to our present-day culture and the way we live our lives.


Cold Lake Museums is a rich and growing trove

of knowledge and artifacts dating from First Nations history prior to contact with European traders, all the way to advanced RCAF equipment that is still in use today. Cold Lake Museums is actually four museums in one.

THE INDIGENOUS MUSEUM shows visitors a way of life that has its roots in the millennia and still exists today. The artifacts and interpretive exhibits serve to educate visitors about Dëne Sųłíné, Cree, and Métis cultures.

THE HERITAGE MUSEUM celebrates the history of the community from the time of first settlement up to the Second World War, and





beyond. Before the development of the oil and gas industry or the construction of RCAF Station Cold Lake, the local economy was built on agriculture, forestry, commercial and sport fishing, and tourism. This gallery honours the first generations of settlers and the community they built.

THE OIL AND GAS MUSEUM explores the geology and the natural history of the region and our emergence as an energy-economy powerhouse. Exhibits show how the techniques of heavy oil extraction have evolved over decades of industrial development.

THE AIR FORCE MUSEUM displays

thousands of artifacts from Cold Lake's military history, from fighter jets to clarinets. But it's much more than a collection of military hardware – the museum offers a glimpse into the lives of RCAF personnel in Cold Lake through more than 70 years of local, Canadian, and world history.

Cold Lake Museums is situated atop Radar Hill, the former site of 42 Radar Squadron's "Pinetree Line" installation from the Cold War era. Visitors can walk inside the gigantic "golf ball" radar dome or get up close to the collection of vintage and modern aircraft.

The site is open from Victoria Day weekend to Labour Day weekend.



With those three drivers in place, an abundance of opportunities opens up. The city is served by enterprises large and small, offering everything from industrial capacity to boutique retail.

Our 17,500 residents receive public services from the municipal, provincial, and federal employees who live and work here. And a vibrant nonprofit sector supports programming and provides employment in community service, recreation, and the arts.





ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Our national defence and energy sectors provide critical mass for technological innovation while driving important training and education capacity.

4 Wing, at Canadian Forces Base Cold Lake, is undergoing physical massive expansion and technological upgrading to accommodate the new CF-35 fighter jets. This multi-year infrastructure investment will bring more than half a billion dollars into our economy.

There are new and ongoing opportunities in

defence electronics, geomatics and aerospace research and development, and with provincial funding Cold Lake will host the 2026 Aerospace Industry Symposium and provincial funding for unmanned systems innovation.

Our K-12 education systems support parents and families while our postsecondary opportunities, particularly through Portage College, equip local graduates with the skills they need to embark on careers in a variety of fields right at home.

Serving members and National Defence employees also make up a significant portion of the local marketplace, spending on goods and services for themselves and their families.



RETAIL

The life's blood of a local economy is its retail market. Consumers have a variety of needs and tastes, and a healthy retail sector offers plenty of choice.

Cold Lake has a broad spectrum of retailers in virtually every sector of the market. In fact, with its 570 licensed businesses, Cold Lake is the retail hub of the entire region.

The consumer economy is anchored by major stores including Walmart, Canadian Tire, Sobeys, Winners, and the shops of Tri-City Mall. Local independent businesses and franchises provide variety and selection.

The city is a retail-friendly economy, with a median household income of \$122,920 – much higher than the Alberta median of \$114,600. This has helped to fuel \$2 million in new retail construction, with our Retail Market & Gap Analysis ongoing.

The City of Cold Lake's Business Retention & Attraction Program offers tax rebates for commercial improvements. The City also participates in labour force programs which have included the Rural Entrepreneur Stream through the Government of Alberta Advantage Immigration Program.


