7.1 Ashmont Daisies

Keith Kornelsen, Assistant Agricultural Fieldman has drafted a letter to address concerns over noxious weeds (oxeye daisy) for County residents and will be sending the letter to residents as early as possible to coordinate a plan with landowners for spraying if necessary.

7.2 Failed Weed Notices

Keith Kornelsen stated that other Counties have had issues with failed Weed Notices. Notices should be given to landowners personally, mailed to them and/or posted on land for success with notices. Giving landowners too many options also contribute to failed Weed Notices.

7.3 Mobile Seed Cleaning

Discussion over concerns with the lack of licensing for the Mobile Seed Cleaning Unit being used within the County.

7.4 Beaver Bounty Update

Warren Leister, Assistant Agricultural Fieldman reviewed the Beaver Bounty Program.

- 2019 first year in program ran Spring and Fall with 39 registered users, which brought in 726 tails and County staff trapped another 390 for a total of 1035 Beaver harvest
- 2020 program only ran in Fall due to COVID with 21 registered users, which brought in 390 tails and County staff trapped another 476 for a total of 855 Beaver harvest
- 2021 program will have requirements:
 - Preregistration with Keith or Warren with land description of where beavers will be coming from
 - Who will be bringing in the beaver tails
 - o AG staff will be checking the site to confirm the water site
 - County to determine how many beavers will be accepted from the land: 10 with a water body and 30 for a creek system
 - Will have to call for an appointment to come in with beaver tails
 - County will be keeping track of how many beavers are coming in from each quarter of land
 - Notching of beaver tails to assist with abuse of the program
- Beaver Bounty dates will be: April 15 June 25 and September 1 -October 29, 2021

Presented on the mowing and spraying plans for 2021, with maps for Council being displayed in the lower-level Board Room at the County office, in addition to the GIS system having the information available to Council under the Agricultural Maintenance 2021 mowing tab, which should be fully operational by June.

- Will be moving more double passes and adding more roads
- Spraying will be mainly around the St. Paul area with follow-up on last years spraying job
- Keep up with the Himalayan Balsam around Horseshoe Bay area, as it is getting less and less
- 30 Club Root fields from 2017 can all grow Canola again this year, 10 fields last year had Club Root
- 4 Rat infestations with 200 rat sightings, of which over half were muskrats
- Discontinue the use of 1080 this year coyote pills
- Strychnine will only be available till March 2022- we have lots of product on hand
- All Summer staff are all returning this year
