- ! The program has been extended. Continue to recycle your electronics (anything with a cord)!
- ! The *expanded Electronics Recycling Project* will keep up to 24,600 tonnes of material out of landfills.
- ! What's included? Audio visual equipment, cell phone & wireless devices, electronic gaming equipment, small home appliances, portable power tools, musical instruments and more (see the chart below)



Electronics Recycling

If it has a power cord, it can be recycled

Electronics contain some measure of potentially poisonous materials such as lead, mercury, cadmium, and others - which makes them **toxic** if not dealt with properly.

Old electronics brought to a County Transfer Station are processed safely and responsibly right here in Alberta. None of the products are sent to, or 'dumped', into developing countries. **Since 1992, 10 million electronics have been recycled in Alberta.**



What happens to the electronics?

Registered Electronics Processors safely disassemble electronics and separate each of the different materials according to the recycling program's requirements.



Commodities like metals, plastics and glass are collected and sold to be made into new products.

Televisions, for example, contain a number of

valuable materials that can be broken down and reused. The steel, aluminum and copper metal found in the wires, cables and circuitry is used as feed stock for new products. The glass from tv screens is melted down, separating the lead and reused in the manufacture of new products.

Place your electronics in the appropriate recycling bins at the Transfer Stations. Each bin is clearly labelled.
