



Most people are in the dark about how to safely dispose of burned out lightbulbs.

Find out why it's important to do so ...

Did you know that some lightbulbs contain harmful substances?

But which ones do and which ones don't?

Lightbulbs like fluorescent, compact fluorescent or mercury vapor bulbs may contain small amounts of cadmium, mercury, fluorine, neon or even lead powder.

The substances are harmful and toxic to humans, animal life and the environment.



Not all lightbulbs contain harmful substances.

But, do you know the difference?

Bringing all of your burned out lightbulbs to a County Transfer Station and deposit them in special containers.

The light bulbs will be properly disposed of without harming anyone or anything.

How does the County dispose of lightbulbs?

A special machine called a tumbler pulverizes the lightbulbs while sucking out many contaminants in an enclosed vacuum space.

The tumbler uses three special filters designed to catch and hold any contaminants.

The filters are, then, properly disposed of.
