



Let's Talk about Recycling Tires

- ! Recycling tires helps the environment and our community.
- ! Since 1992, 100 million tires have been recycled in Alberta. That's enough tires to wrap around the equator twice.

Why Recycle Tires?

Discarded tires pose a number of health risks. Tire fires can occur easily, burning for months and creating substantial pollution in the ground and toxic fumes in the air.

When left out in the open, tires collect water and become a breeding ground for mosquitos including those carrying West Nile Virus.

Recycled tires are a valuable source of material that can be turned into new products.

Under the Alberta Tire Recycling Program, the following types of tires <u>are accepted</u> at Transfer Stations:

- * All passenger/ light truck tires
- * All semi tires
- * Any Off-the-Road (OTR) tire with a rim size 39 inches or less
- * Agriculture (AG) tires with a bead of approximately 1 to 2 inches

Under the Alberta Recycling Program, items <u>not</u> accepted are tracks from skidoos, skid steers or larger equipment, forklift tires that have a steel band or are solid, neither foam filled tires or the foam fill product, rubber debris such as belting, pails, hosing, or tire tubes.
